#### **MESSAGE FROM MAYOR KING**

Hello Amity,

It's hard to believe we're already into the fourth month of 2024. It has been a busy start to the year and things won't be slowing down anytime soon!

Ending last month with the Amity Daffodil Festival, and a car show, along with the annual Egg hunt, really set the tone for exciting and expanding opportunities for community and involvement in our little city. My thanks go to Amity's Downtown Improvement Group (DIG), the Amity Fire District, Amity Parents and Teachers Together (APATT), and all the many volunteers who share their time, talents, and energy to help make events like this successful. As we look ahead to summer, plans are already underway for many more fun and community-oriented happenings locally. Next up will be City –wide clean-up day so make sure to mark your calendars!

On a more serious note, I would like to write about an area of involvement in Amity that is currently struggling and could use your help. The Amity City Council consists of 6 Council seats, along with the mayor's position. For the past 11 months one of those Council seats has been vacant. While business can still be conducted, having a vacant position is detrimental to the Council and to the city as a whole. With every policy, budget, and quasi-judicial decision made the citizens of Amity benefit from robust conversation, differing perspectives, and individual advocacy from each of their elected or appointed Councilors. For almost a year now one of those seats has sat empty at our meetings. Our current City Council is strong, cooperative, and motivated BUT I know that filling this vacancy and operating with all positions filled is in the best interest of Amity. We are in a similar position currently with Amity's Planning Commission. Only three of five Planning Commission positions are filled as of now.

I am not blind to the fact that there are barriers that can interfere with people's ability to step into these roles. Time constraints, scheduling conflicts, lack of childcare, the list goes on... That said, I want to put it out there that volunteering for a position in local government is not exclusive and is something that most citizens can do. The most basic requirements are that you must be 18 years or older and a registered voter. For Council positions you must reside inside the city limits of Amity. The minimum time commitment is devoting approximately 5 hours/month to preparation and attending twice monthly evening meetings. The Planning Commission meets monthly as needed, which is currently less than 12 meetings per year.

People with all levels of experience are welcome to apply. Handbooks, training, and mentorship are readily available!
