Message from Mayor Rachel King

Happy June Amity! It's hard to believe that we are already to the halfway point of 2023.

I'd like to share a few highlights of the past month, as well as some upcoming events to look forward to-

The Amity budget committee successfully approved the City Budget for the 2023-24 fiscal year. This budget is now slated for Council consideration and approval at our June Council meeting. I appreciate the hard work of staff and committee volunteers and their efforts through this process. There are conservative revenue projections paired with an emphasis on planning for longer-term future needs in the latest budget. This approach serves well to insulate against unknown future circumstances while still targeting previously unmet needs and enhancing service levels.

As many of you have noticed, the dryer weather has allowed for street patching and repair to be accomplished throughout the city over the past few weeks. On June 14th Council will hear presentation of the Streets Inventory work that has taken place over the last quarter. This work should lead toward more systematic prioritization of maintenance and upkeep, and over time, street system improvements that bring the overall quality of our non-highway roadways to a higher standard Amity-wide. Having this data will also aid in seeking additional grants and outside funding opportunities. I thank you all for your patience as work is being done to address street issues in an intentional and sustainable way. Also, yay for pothole repairs!

Along with Council, I look forward to our upcoming 'Movie in the Park' happening on June 23rd. This is a fun way to kick off summer. I'm excited for another late night of popcorn, laughs, and the sense of community these types of events bring. Remember that this event falls on one of the longest days of the year and won't get started until after dusk. Plan ahead: grab dinner at one of our amazing local restaurants, gather a blanket or lawn chairs, maybe even change into pajamas. Be prepared to stay up late and have a good, family friendly, time. I hope you're able to join us.

Lastly, Amity City Council continues to work through the hiring process for our next City Administrator. On May 22nd we hosted top candidates for city tours, interviews, and a community meet and greet. Thank you to all the citizens who took time to come down to City Hall to interact with the chosen individuals and provide feedback. Based on the outcome of interviews, and community and stakeholder input, the City Council has chosen to move forward, by unanimous vote, to extend a tentative offer of employment. Contingent on contract negotiations, a public announcement of filling our City Administrator vacancy will be coming soon!

As we move into summer there are many exciting things to look forward to here in Amity.

Storm water tips: actions to decrease your environmental footprint and reduce pollution entering local water ways-

When it rains, snows, or sleets, water hits hard surfaces and takes anything on that surface with it, through drains, pipes, and ditches and into local rivers, lakes, and streams. Known as storm water, this runoff is a major source of water pollution. Listed below are a few things each of us can do to help reduce negative storm water impacts.

- *Keep ditches, culverts, and drains on and near your property clear and free of debris and litter
- *Pick up pet waste promptly
- *Be careful with chemicals. Read and follow labels of pesticides and fertilizers and avoid any application on pavement
- *Quickly address any vehicle fluid or oil leaks
- *Plant native trees, flowers, and shrubs, and enhance green space around your property
