## Message from Mayor Rachel King:

Hello Amity,

November is upon us! As we enter this month of thanksgiving, I want to express my thanks to the residents of our wonderful community. Last month the City of Amity held a second city-wide clean-up day for 2023, a Harvest Party at the Community Center, and put on our 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Pumpkin carving and decorating contest. I appreciate all who were able to volunteer their time to help make these possible and all who showed up and/or made the effort to participate. It is events like these that bring our community together and carry on the legacy of what small towns are best known for. I feel privileged to be a part of these activities and to lead this community where residents not only regularly have opportunities to connect with their neighbors and have fun together, but also look out for each other, and lend a hand where it's needed. Amity does well in living up to the meaning of its name!

### A few infrastructure updates:

Salt Creek bridge is slated to reopen this month. The last official correspondence from ODOT, addressing questions from the City Council, indicated that the project was on track for completion mid-November. Additional updates or the confirmation of an exact opening date will be shared on the city website and Facebook page when available.

Amity's drinking water improvement project is also well underway. New intake machinery has been installed into the river, raw water line replacement is scheduled, cement chemical troughs have been poured, backwash ponds are excavated, and exterior construction of new pretreatment building is nearly complete. While this list of recent accomplishments may not sound exciting to the average water user, what they represent is significant progress toward long awaited improvements our water system, and tangible investments into the long-term health and stability of our drinking water infrastructure.

I'd also like to share a few reminders as we settle into the rainy season:

Now is a great time to check on the condition of your gutters and downspouts, as well as ditches and storm drains near your home. Keeping these clear of buildup and debris allows for proper drainage to occur and helps prevent flooding within yards and roadways. Where feasible, directing flowing water from downspouts further away from paved surfaces also helps reduce pollution into local waterways.

As always, please reach out with any questions, concerns, or ideas for improvements within the city.
