ssage from Mayor Rachel King

Hello Amity, and welcome to the month of October. While the summer season is now behind us activities around the city have not slowed down. Before I share more about upcoming events, I want to take a moment to thank everyone who has been able to attend and/or participate in recent meetings of the Amity City Council and Planning Commission.

Just over two years ago I was appointed to fill the remaining term as Mayor for our city. At that time, I listed a few priorities that I hoped to work towards. One of those goals was to encourage involvement in City governance and to promote overall community engagement and opportunities for connection.

Your City Council has embraced and supported this challenge; as a community I recognize many of you doing so as well. I appreciate hearing from you all and I am encouraged by seeing those who show up to share their voice and opinions. As elected (and appointed) representatives the best guidance your City Council can get is hearing directly from citizens. Thank you and please continue to reach out and be involved!

I would also like to share that the City of Amity was recently awarded a \$75,000 grant through Oregon State Parks to upgrade and widen the walking paths throughout the City Park. This is a huge win for us all and will greatly enhance the usability and aesthetics of our community park. This work is expected to be completed before the summer of 2024.

In additional park news: The trees within the park were recently assessed for their health and safety. While some maintenance and trimming were necessary our beautiful trees have overall received a satisfactory report. As we head into Fall there is much to look forward to, and to be grateful for, here in Amity.

Storm Drains: With the arrival of Fall and the start of Oregon's traditional rainy season, we want to remind homeowners that they are responsible for keeping the drainage ditches on their property clear of leaves and debris that may cause flooding. We also ask that if you see clogged City storm drains around town to please contact City Hall. We will send crews out to clear clogged storm drains reported to the City.
