Here are the things that City Hall would like you to know going into the Holidays!

- Water Shutoffs in December: Mayor King indicated that she's going to suspend water shutoffs in December. More details to follow, but here's to an early Christmas present courtesy of Mayor King!
- SHOP LOCAL!! This holiday season, take the opportunity to shop Amity businesses. We've wonderful establishments here in Amity. Give the gift of Amity this year.
- Red Cross Blood Drive: On Wednesday December 27th the City of Amity will host a blood drive at City Hall. Sign up online https://www.redcrossblood.org Give the gift of life this year; GIVE BLOOD!
- Financial Assistance Available: YCAP, PGE and other churches and charities will offer help to cover your bills this season. Stop by City Hall to get more information or reach out to your billing agency for such support.
- Pets in the cold: Your pets don't like being cold! Ensure your pets have ready access to warmth, shelter, and food & water during the cold and rainy weather during the winter. If you can bring your pets indoors, please consider doing so.
- **Keeping the community "clean" during the holidays:** With the elections over, please take down your political signs. Also, giving away things for free by placing them on the curb is fine...for a while. After a few days it becomes junk and a nuisance. Please ensure that after a few days you haul what is not claimed to the dump.
- Winter weather prep! Take the time, now, to ensure your gutters and drains are cleaned, your water heater is working properly, and your heating system is fully functional. Chimneys and ventilation systems should be clear of debris. Replace batteries in your smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, and other sensors. And ensure that your tree doesn't get too dry while it's on display!

Tree Lighting:

The collaborative effort works in Amity to host another tree lighting event which also includes a festive parade, goodie bag distribution, and refreshments to kick off the holiday season. The tree lighting will take place at 6 p.m. on Friday, December 1st at the Community Center. The festively decorated fire truck parade will be touring the town at the same time. After the tree is lit, come to the Fire Hall for goodie bags provided by the Amity Firefighters Auxiliary. Santa will be attending too. Many resources including government, nonprofits, businesses, and individuals help to make this event a success. This year thanks go out to Amity Volunteer Firefighters, Amity Firefighters Auxiliary, City of Amity, City of Willamina and Public Works.
