Message from Mayor Rachel King

Welcome to March, Amity. As we look forward to our transition out of wintertime here are a few other events and reminders to keep in mind:

Daylight savings time starts Sunday March 10th.

Backyard burn season is set to begin March 1st, please call the YC burn line (503) 472-3344 each day before burning or consider taking advantage of free yard debris drop off options through Recology in McMinnville.

The week of March 25th will be spring break for Amity School District students.

March 30th is the date of Amity's annual Daffodil Festival AND the Amity Fire Department's Easter egg hunt in the City Park!

This month I would also like to highlight and share some statistic from the Yamhill County Sheriff's office that relate to the services they provide to the City of Amity:

During the last quarter of 2023 YCSO responded to 453 calls for service within Amity. The average number of traffic stops has been 36 monthly, and they have increased presence and visibility on school routes during drop off and pick up times. A Sheriff's office representative is present at all Council meetings to hear citizen comments and answer Council questions as well. Complete monthly statistics are presented to your City Council and can be found online, on the City's website, within the Council agenda packets published prior to each meeting. As a reminder, if you would like to report a non-urgent concern, speeding on certain streets, areas of repeated traffic violations, or have law enforcement specific questions, please contact YCOM at their non-emergency number (503) 434-6500 and ask to leave a message for the Amity Deputies. In case of emergency please always dial 911.

Amity Info Corner – Did you know?

Mayor King and the Council want to address some of your questions and concerns from the City Survey.

<u>Street Sweeping</u>: To save money, Amity Public Works coordinated street sweeping with a local contractor. Our contractor sweeps our streets during gaps in their schedule. So, our sweeping is not regularly scheduled. This makes it cheaper for the community, but it does limit the notice we get as to when the streets will be swept, and which streets will be completed. It's a tradeoff and one we accept.

New City Website: The City of Amity has worked to update their website through a new vendor that will provide various new features and functions. As we near the end of this process, staff is working to ensure that the information on the website is up to date and relevant.
